27 new members join club; 21 via member drive

Twenty-seven new members have joined the club so far in 2022, 21 of them during the spring membership drive, which runs to June 1.

"We are excited to have new members and hope they take advantage of everything the club offers," Interim President John Ryan said. "I know everyone will make them feel welcome."

Of the 27, seven are Class A members, 12 are junior members, six are social members and one is a non-resident member. In addition, one person has joined as a fellowship member. Three members have left the club and one switched from a Class A to a fellowship.

"The 2022 Spring Membership Drive is going rather well," said Membership Director Katrina Butler. "We are two months into the drive and our members are doing an awesome job extending the invitation to new members." Under the spring drive, members receive a \$100 club certificate for bringing a new member into the club.

Most of the new Class A members will pay half-price dues for the first year. The junior members dues is discounted according to age, ranging from 23 to 39.

Tourney, summerfest planned for Memorial Day
